THE BEGINNING OF GREY BULL RESCUE

Based in Tampa, Fla., Grey Bull Rescue was founded by veteran and Purple Heart recipient Bryan Stern to rescue Americans and allies trapped in disaster and conflict zones around the globe. The organization operates on two fronts - The Grey Bull Rescue Foundation, a filed 501(c)3nonprofit organization that is entirely donor-funded, and The Grey Bull Rescue Group, a for-profit organization founded to directly assist governments and other entities with rescuing citizens in danger.

Stern and his team of other veterans and elite special operations experts began their work during the failed U.S. evacuation of Afghanistan, successfully rescuing countless Americans and allies.

Since then, nearly 7,000 men, women, children, and even their beloved pets have been pulled from the brink by Bryan and his team. That's 7,000 stories of hope and lives getting another chance, all because we step in where others can't or won't.

THE TEAM

Grey Bull Rescue is led by Bryan Stern, a multi-tour combat veteran of the U.S. Army and Navy and a Purple Heart recipient. With over 27 years of experience in intelligence and special operations, Stern specializes in hostage rescue, counter-terrorism, counter-proliferation, critical technology protection, sensitive activities, foreign material acquisition, unconventional warfare, and discretionary operations in contested or denied areas. He is assisted by a team of seasoned combat veterans from the most elite special operations and intelligence units of the U.S. military. Supporting them is a team of committed volunteers who form the true backbone of Grey Bull Rescue. From on-the-ground deployment in war and disaster zones to remote case management, event planning, fundraising, and translation services, our volunteers are tireless in their dedication to saving lives.

A multiple-tour combat veteran of the United States Army & Navy, courageous 9/11 first responder, and Purple Heart recipient, Bryan has over 25 years of military experience focused on special operations specializing in Hostage Rescue, Counter-Terrorism, Counter-Proliferation, Critical Technology Protection, and Unconventional Warfare. He is the Chairman and Founder of Grey Bull Rescue.

THE BEGINNING

When Bryan saw Afghans struggling and Americans trying to escape the Taliban after the U.S. withdrawal from Afghanistan in 2021, he decided to act. Together with a team of former special operations and intelligence veterans, he led swift rescue missions amid the chaos. They rescued 117 stranded Americans in a single day during their debut mission. This success led to the founding of the Grey Bull Rescue Foundation. Since then, Stern and his team have deployed on 616 missions, saving more than 7,000 American lives. This includes missions in Ukraine, Sudan, Haiti, Israel, and Gaza, along with operations in the United States during the Maui wildfires and Hurricane lan.

MISSION CONTRIBUTIONS

Stern is a frequent contributor to global media, academia, and geopolitical security forums. He aids U.S. and allied governments, along with commercial and financial sectors, to address and manage geopolitical crises.

Stern holds positions on various boards dedicated to strategy, technological innovation, and foreign policy and is a member of several professional organizations including the Young Presidents' Organization (YPO) and Business Executives for National Security (BENS).

He is the sole U.S. Navy Officer inducted into the Order of Saint Maurice by the Chief of the U.S. Army Infantry. Bryan is also a Knowlton Award and Nimitz Award recipient for his contributions to military intelligence and leadership.



KIRILLO ALEXANDROV AMERICAN RESCUED VICTIM OF WAR CRIMES

Kirillo Alexandrov, an American farmer living in southern Ukraine, was captured by Russian forces on April 2, 2022, and subjected to brutal war crimes, including mock executions and beatings, under false espionage charges. Despite the challenges, Bryan Stern and his team orchestrated a daring rescue mission, evading an assassination attempt by Russian forces and successfully transporting Kirillo through the war-torn zone to safety in Poland. After 37 days, Kirillo was reunited with his mother. Now back in the U.S., Kirillo works as a kickboxing trainer, speaks publicly, and serves as a "Survivor Ambassador" for the Grey Bull Rescue Foundation. His ordeal highlights the resilience and bravery possible in the face of extreme adversity, with ongoing efforts by the Department of Justice to hold his captors accountable.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

1. WHAT IS GREY BULL RESCUE? WHY DID IT START?

Our name, "Grey Bull," is inspired by a profound story of hope and resilience. During the Vietnam War, American soldiers were held captive by the North Vietnamese at the Son Tay prison. Colonel Arthur "Bull" Simons led a daring raid on the prison, only to find that the prisoners had been moved shortly before the operation. Despite not being rescued, the prisoners were filled with hope, knowing that other brave Americans were fighting for their freedom. This gave them the strength and will to survive their captivity.

The Grey Bull team strives to bring this same sense of hope to Americans and allies in need, giving them a lifeline in times of crisis. The "Bull" in Grey Bull symbolizes the hope and determination embodied by Colonel Simons and his team. We are here to offer hope and fight for those who need it most—just as Bull Simons did.

Based in Tampa, Fla., Grey Bull Rescue (GBR) operates on two fronts - The Grey Bull Rescue Foundation, a filed 501(c)3 nonprofit organization that is entirely donor-funded, and The Grey Bull Rescue Group, a for-profit organization founded to directly assist governments and other entities with rescuing citizens in danger. GBR's team of elite special operations experts began their work during the failed U.S. evacuation of Afghanistan, successfully rescuing countless Americans and allies. Since then, nearly 7,000 women, children, and even beloved pets credit Stern and his team with safely evacuating them from disaster zones. This includes operations in 29 countries, including Ukraine, Russia, Sudan, Israel, Haiti and in the United States during the devastating Maui wildfires and following Hurricane Ian in Florida.

2. HOW DOES GREY BULL RESCUE DETERMINE WHERE TO GO TO RESCUE AMERICANS?

Grey Bull Rescue operates in 'The Grey Space' where other government entities cannot provide assistance to rescue Americans and allies from crisis. The team operates deep behind enemy lines and in the most dangerous conditions, often in countries with no U.S. military or diplomatic presence. Grey Bull Rescue receives requests from people in need all around the globe. The team is always closely watching geopolitical situations to determine if their assistance is needed.

3. HOW CAN PEOPLE REQUEST HELP FROM GREY BULL RESCUE?

Any individual, or those with a friend or loved one trapped in a crisis or conflict zone can request assistance directly at Greybullrescue.org. Simply click the 'Request Help' button to begin communicating with GBR's team of case managers.

4. HOW MANY RESCUES HAS GREY BULL RESCUE SUCCESSFULLY COMPLETED AND WHO CONDUCTS THE OPERATIONS?

To date, the GBR team has rescued nearly 7,000 men, women, children (and even beloved pets) from conflict zones both domestic and abroad. Rescue operations are conducted by a team of combat veterans from the most elite units and agencies within the U.S. intelligence and special operations communities. Behind the scenes, operations are enabled by teams of case managers working throughout the United States, many of them volunteers and people previously rescued by the GBR team.

5. HOW DOES GREY BULL RESCUE FUND ALL OF THESE MISSIONS?

Grey Bull Rescue's filed 501(c)3 nonprofit side is 100% donorfunded and relies on the generosity of others to fund multimillion dollar operations. GBR also operates a separate forprofit organization where governments and other agencies can contract the team to help rescue citizens in crisis.

6. HOW CAN PEOPLE VOLUNTEER AND DONATE TO HELP EVACUEES?

Grey Bull Rescue Launches to Extend Lifesaving Reach to Americans & Allies in Crisis Situations

Military Veteran and Renowned Rescuer Bryan Stern Unveils New Organization Poised to Elevate Humanitarian Efforts Globally

TAMPA, Fla. [June, 2024] — Bryan Stern, a distinguished figure known for his heroic endeavors in rescuing nearly 7,000 Americans and allies from conflict zones and natural calamities across the globe, including Afghanistan, Russia, Ukraine, Sudan, Israel, and Haiti, has announced the establishment of a new, groundbreaking organization and foundation dedicated to advancing humanitarian missions worldwide.

Stern, a decorated 27-year military veteran, embarked on his rescue journey in 2021 during the tumultuous U.S. evacuation from Afghanistan, where he rescued countless stranded Americans and allies. Since then, Stern and his adept team have executed 616 missions, safeguarding nearly 7,000 lives, both domestically and internationally. The new initiative seeks to:

- Amplify rescue efforts, extending aid and support to even more Americans in dire circumstances, including those affected by conflict, human trafficking, hostage situations, and other crises.
- The organization will operate on dual fronts: a for-profit entity pioneering innovative crisis response solutions and a foundation dedicated to providing sustained assistance to vulnerable populations.

Reflecting on his journey, Stern remarked, "Leading these rescue missions has been a profound privilege, and witnessing the impact on countless lives has only reinforced our commitment to this cause. What began as a single act of rescue in 2021 has blossomed into a formidable team effort. Now, as the demand for assistance continues to surge, it's clear that we need to expand our reach."

"I am inundated with appeals for aid and support, and Grey Bull Rescue stands ready to answer the call," Stern affirmed. "The time has come to transcend our current nonprofit framework and establish an organization and foundation capable of saving even more lives and fostering enduring solutions for communities worldwide."

Stern envisions a future characterized by strategic partnerships and community-driven initiatives aimed at tackling multifaceted challenges. He will be supported by a dedicated team of more than 70 members and volunteers who have been instrumental in previous missions led by Stern.

ABOUT GREY BULL RESCUE:

Founded and helmed by Bryan Stern, Grey Bull Rescue is a veteran-led, donor-supported international rescue organization and filed 501(c)3 non-profit headquartered in Tampa, Fla., with global operations. Specializing in operating within "The Grey Zone," where governmental presence is not available, Grey Bull Rescue provides evacuation assistance to individuals affected by conflict zones and natural disasters worldwide. Notably, Bryan Stern spearheaded the first air-rescue missions from Afghanistan following the Taliban's takeover and has facilitated the safe return of numerous Americans from captivity and unlawful detention in Russian-occupied Ukraine and Russia. Additionally, he orchestrated the first evacuations of Americans during the Sudanese civil war and executed lifesaving missions in Israel, Haiti, and even Maui during wildfires.
